

## **Sub Project 8 – Sustainable Development – Assessment Tools**

### **1. Project Statement**

The core purpose of this project is to produce a suite of assessment tools – centred on the MOLAND model – that will allow the implications of ‘business as usual’ and policy initiatives to be assessed in an integrated fashion. The air quality and noise, biodiversity, climate change, sustainable development (transport, urban sprawl) sub-programmes will be implemented so as to allow assessment of options in their domain, e.g. using SATURN in the transport field, but specifically to link to the others, via Moland, such that an integrated view will be generated.
